Acupuncture for Your Pets at country View Veterinary Service

Dr. Andrea Lanphear is certified in veterinary acupuncture from the Chi Institute of Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine. Acupuncture has many benefits for pets such as relieving pain from arthritis and helping the body heal itself by improving the flow of Qi. Qi (pronounced *chee*) flows throughout the body in pathways called meridians. When Qi is interrupted by any pathologic factor, such as pain or an infection, disease may occur. Acupuncture points are located near high density areas of free nerve endings, small vessels and the lymphatic system. Acupuncture stimulates the release of the body's natural pain killers (endorphins) and other neurotransmitters such as serotonin. Some animals can not tolerate traditional pain relievers such as NSAIDS (non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs) because of

liver, kidney or gastrointestinal disease. Acupuncture, on the other hand, is safe for almost all animals. Acupuncture and herbal therapy are often used in conjunction with western medicine to get the benefits of both worlds. Health issues that eastern medicine can benefit in addition to arthritis are kidney disease, liver disease, allergies, cancer, intervertebral disc disease, behavior, endocrine disease, seizures, and others. Acupuncture sessions typically last between 45 minutes to one hour. Animals often fall asleep during their treatments. The number of sessions needed depends on each individual case and are usually scheduled 2-4 weeks apart. Veterinary acupuncture can only be performed by a licensed veterinarian. Ask us if acupuncture will help your small animal companion.

The Scoop

Over time, intestinal parasites develop drug resistance and may become increasingly difficult to manage. We recommend performing semiannual quantitative fecal egg counts to identify parasites in your pets. For horse owners who empirically deworm their horses every 8 weeks, you may save money on equine deworming products by submitting bimonthly fecal samples and treating only the affected individuals. This may minimize drug resistance, too.

Equine Vaccine Updates

- Vaccinate foals at 6, 7 and 9 months of age.
- Vaccinate pregnant mares for EHV at 5, 7, 9 of pregnancy.
- We offer serum antibody titer analysis for most equine vaccines.
